Many will remember that in the Society's centenary year (1979) a number of medallions were produced for us by the Royal Mint of which one face was based on the design by Archibald Knox for a medal to mark the Society's silver jubilee year; the other face having a view of Castle Rushen as it was about the time of the Society's founding. A small number of these medals had been retained to be presented to those giving outstanding service to the Society – and Clare clearly deserved one of these.

### **Excursion Secretary**

Its time for fresh face and ideas and younger walking legs and knees! Pat Newton wants to stand down from this post next year.

What does it involve?

- Basically with the help of the Committee and membership at large, coming up with ideas for excursions including family orientated ones e.g. based on previous winter lecture series, heritage open days, and one's own ideas; being willing to contact potential leaders and landowners; help will always be available from Pat and others to identify the latter; linking up with them can be very enjoyable and rewarding in terms of knowledge; you don't have to lead excursions albeit it is good if you want to.
- preferably to attend the excursions and act as back marker / and carrier of first aid kit on them or to ensure someone else will do this for you;
- when needed, take bookings for and enquiries about excursions;
- getting a 'blurb' for the excursion programme and a write up, preferably from the leader, for inclusion in the Proceedings.

The excursion programme is roughly based on having one weekend afternoon walk once a month April to September inclusive and one midweek evening walk once a month May to July inclusive. However, as can be seen from this summer's programme, there are no set rules on this! One goes with what one can get! Variety is the spice of life! The Society also tries to join in with a walk during Heritage Open Days. For the past few years Pat has led or helped lead the latter walks.

While Pat has organised a number of off-Island excursions this is not a pre requisite of the role. Clearly that depends on time and resources, both of which are recognised as being in increasingly short supply.

With this advance warning it would be good to have someone - or more than one person - willing to come on board in time to work with Pat preparing next year's programme prior to the role being handed over. Ideas can be collected and worked on at all times of the year. We already have one in!

Both in terms of trying to identify, and help protect, the best of Ellan Vannin's built heritage research on the history and architecture of buildings needs to be undertaken. This can be in response to proposals to Register a building or in response to a planning application proposal to alter it. When making comments IOMNHAS always endeavours to fulfill its stated Objects and simultaneously inform and educate the decision makers on such matters. Sometimes research for walks, one's own or other people's, is also undertaken. The research can require a mixture of working from imuseum and family history resources at home, library resources at MNH Manx Museum and the Public Records Office at Springvalley or contacting individuals for their knowledge. Help in undertaking / putting together such research would be welcomed. Sometimes it has to be done at comparatively short notice. Guidance will be given. Interested?
